RECYCLING LAWS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

In 1989, Assembly Bill 939 (AB939) became law. This bill mandated local jurisdictions to divert 25% of solid waste from a landfill by 1995 and increase the diversion rate to 75% by 2000.

E-WASTE

In 2003, Senate Bill 20 (SB20) became law. The Electronic Waste Recycling (E-Waste) law mandates that computers, TVs, and other electronic devices are recycled when they reach their end-of-life.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

In 2012, Assembly Bill 341 (AB341) became law. This law mandates that all Farmersville commercial and industrial businesses, any public entity (i.e. the Farmersville School District), and any multi-family apartment complex with five (5) or more units that generates 4 cubic yards or more of solid waste per week must subscribe for recycling services.

MATTRESS LAW

In 2015, Senate Bill 254 (SB254) became law. This law mandates mattress retailers must collect a mattress recycling fee at the time of sale. The law further mandates that mattress retailers must offer to collect the purchaser's old mattress at no cost to the purchaser upon delivery of the new mattress.

PLASTIC BAG

In 2016, Proposition 67 (Plastic Bag Law) went into full effect throughout California. The law banned free one-time-use plastic bags and paper bags in large retail stores. It also requires some retailers to charge a 10-cent (\$.10) minimum charge on all plastic or paper bags.

PLASTIC STRAW

In 2018, Assembly Bill 1884 (AB1884) also known as the "Plastic Straw Ban" prohibits full-service restaurants in California from handing out single-use plastic straws to patrons, unless upon request from the customer.

COMMERCIAL ORGANICS

In 2019, Assembly Bill 1826 (AB1826) Requires all businesses and multifamily residential homes with five (5) or more units that generate four (4) or more cubic yards of solid waste per week must have organic waste recycling services. Organics include, food, yard trimmings, nonhazardous wood, and food-soiled paper.
