

Frequently Asked Questions:

Does the City of Farmersville enforce the ADA?

The City of Farmersville does not enforce the ADA through a citation process. The ADA is enforced by the Department of Justice (DOJ), the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), and through private or class action lawsuits. The City of Farmersville enforces the accessibility requirements of the California Building Code for Alterations and new construction during the plan check and building inspection process.

What is an ADA Coordinator?

An ADA Coordinator is an employee designated to coordinate the City of Farmersville compliance efforts under the ADA. Duties include:

- Responding to grievances/complaints.
- Coordination disability and accessibility related training for employees.
- Developing and/or implementing plans to improve services for people with disabilities
- Advising city departments as questions arise.
