**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE  
ADOPTING A TITLE VI NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY**

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq.) prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville is committed to ensuring compliance with Title VI and all related statutes, regulations, and directives in all of its programs, services, and activities; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the City of Farmersville to prevent discrimination and ensure equitable access to all individuals regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, or income status; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville desires to formalize and adopt a Title VI Non-Discrimination Policy to ensure compliance and promote fairness and inclusivity in the delivery of public services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City of Farmersville hereby adopts the Title VI Non-Discrimination Policy, ensuring that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, or income status, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity administered by the City.
2. The Public Works Director, Title VI Coordinator shall be responsible for the implementation, monitoring, and enforcement of this policy, ensuring that all employees, contractors, and sub-recipients comply with Title VI requirements.
3. The City shall provide training to relevant personnel on Title VI compliance and procedures and maintain appropriate records to document compliance efforts.
4. The City shall establish a complaint process to allow individuals to file grievances regarding potential Title VI violations, and complaints shall be investigated in a timely and fair manner.
5. The City shall ensure meaningful access to programs and services for individuals with limited English proficiency (LEP) and those with disabilities, in accordance with federal and state guidelines.
6. The City Clerk shall make this resolution and the Title VI Non-Discrimination Policy available to the public and shall post it on the City's official website.
7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.




